### **GLENN CALLISON ANNOUNCES TEXAS HOUSE ELECTION BID**

**PLANO, TEXAS – October 28, 2013, 5:02 PM** – Glenn Callison, a 25-year Plano resident, life-long conservative and proven civic leader, announced his candidacy for the District 66 seat in the Texas House of Representatives.
