STATE REPRESENTATIVE JEFF LEACH FILES FOR RE-ELECTION

PLANO –Today State Representative Jeff Leach officially filed his paperwork to run for re-election to the Texas House of Representatives and continue his service and commitment to the citizens of House District 67. During his first term in the 83rd Legislature, Leach built a strong conservative record of reducing the size and scope of government and fighting to promote and protect our pro-family, Texas values.

Upon filing, Representative Leach stated, "Serving as an advocate for the great people of District 67 is the honor of a lifetime. More than ever I am committed to continuing my service on their behalf in the Texas House of Representatives by promoting free-market, fiscally responsible policies that will keep Texas on its solid path towards economic prosperity and fighting for the Texas values of faith, family and freedom that we hold so dear."
